Games for matching pairs:

Cut up cards and glue onto colored paper. Game ideas:

- 1) Learner can simply look for pairs,
- 2) Play Concentration (cards face down, take turns turning over pairs to find matches),
- 3) Go Fish: deal 4 cards each, ask each other for matching card, and draw from the center pile if the other player can't supply it; s/he with the most pairs wins.

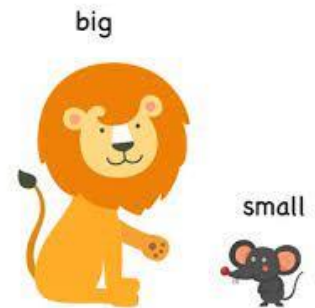
