Cut up the words cards. Learner reads them aloud and places them in the right category (and discusses meaning).

Bonus question: Do you know another way to write the sound (ī)?

Usually, -y makes the sound (ī) at the end of one-syllable words (by, cry, my, dry, spy etc.)

and the sound (ē) at the end of words with more than one syllable (happy, baby, pretty, candy, silly, etc.).

Here we have some exceptions to that pattern: rely, deny, supply, apply, deny.
