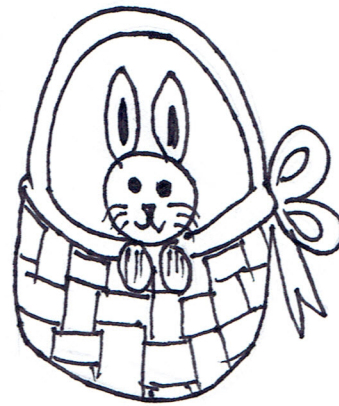


### Ken's Pet Rabbit and Kitten



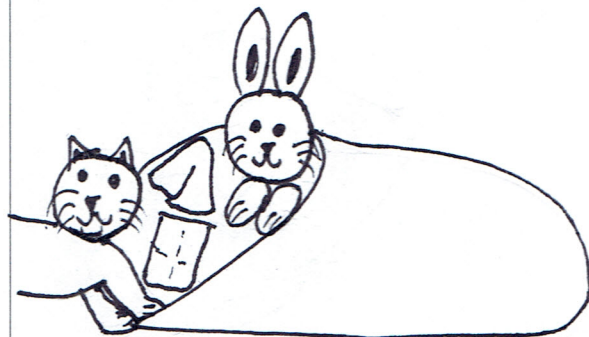
Dad said Ken can pick pets.











### Two-Part Puzzle

This type of puzzle allows the learner to match the word to its picture with a built-in self-check.

**Preparation:** To create a game for any lesson, paste the 12 word-list word/picture pairs into the two sides of each puzzle (match word to picture). (Variations: opposites, past/present verbs, rhymes...)

Glue onto colored paper (coloring, lamination optional) and cut out halves. **Play:** Match halves!
