He sees a frog **hopping** by the pond. Sam is **running** after the frog! His **happiness** is clear to see.




Ben needs a tool. Sam is a **playful** pet. He is very **helpful** to Ben. He brings a stick to the cabin.

Four-in-A-Row Reading Game for 2 players

You will need: Attached board, preferably laminated; one die; Coloured counters for each player, approximately 20

How to Play:

1. Roll the die.
2. Read a word with the same number as the die.
3. Place one coloured counter on the word if read (and translated?) correctly.
4. The winner is the first one to have 4 in a row either vertically, horizontally or diagonally.

Categories

- 1) Word ends in consonant + -y, suffix starts with a consonant: Change the y to i, then add the suffix.
- 2) One-syllable words ending in cvc, suffix starts with a vowel: Double the last consonant, then add the suffix.
- 3) Two-syllable words ending in cvc with the accent on the final syllable, if suffix starts with a vowel: Also double the last consonant then add the suffix.
- 4) Words (some end in vowel+y) + suffix -ful: Just add -ful.
- 5) Words that end with magic e: If the suffix starts with a vowel, drop the magic e, then add the suffix.
- 6) Words that end with magic e: If the suffix starts with a consonant, just add the suffix.

Four-in-a-Row Reading Game

1. Word ends in consonant+ -y, suffix starts with a consonant: Change the y to i, then add the suffix.	2.
