

Sentence Soup

Preparation: Cut up all the words in each of these sentences and clip them together with a paper clip. (Each sentence is a different color, for easy sorting, but if you don't have a color printer you can mark the back of each word with a different color or glue the words of each sentence onto different colored paper, etc.)

Play: Ask the learner to assemble the sentence in the right order. (Give a hint: sentences begin with capital letters and end with a punctuation mark.) Then have the learner write the proper sentence on the board/in the machberet chachama.

Make up your own sentences, or borrow from stories, to play sentence soup for any lesson.

in the nest.

A hen is in Ned's tent.
