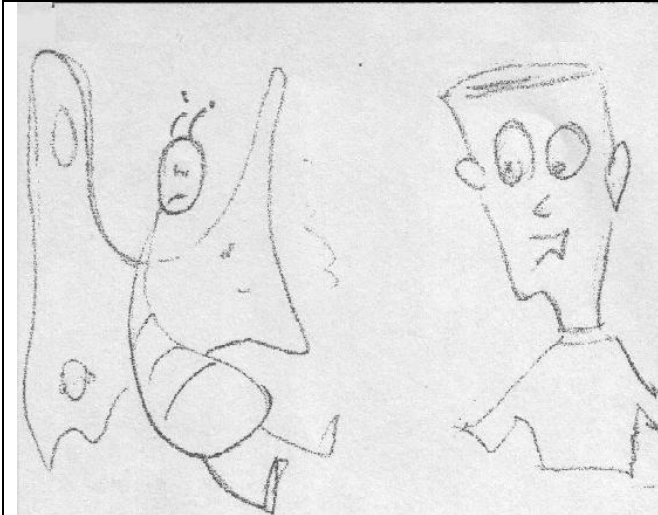
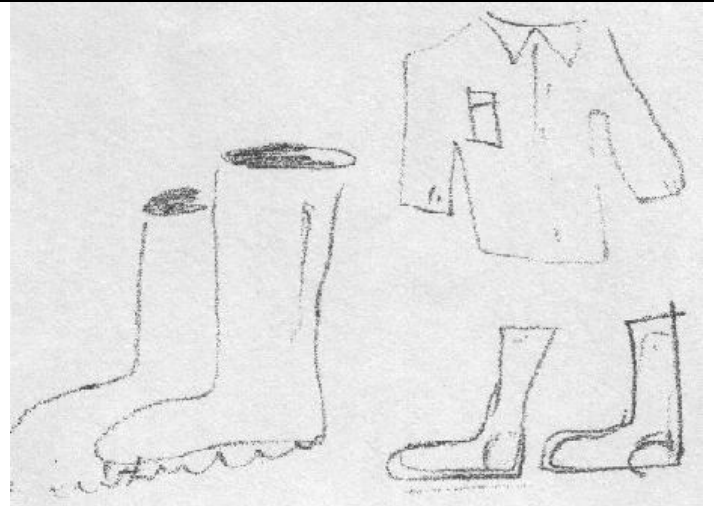


Dan's Moth Needs Things



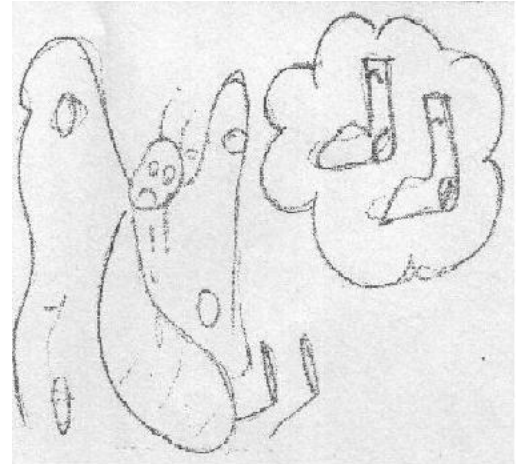
Dan has a pet moth. Dan's pet moth is cold. He has nothing to put on.

The moth is very sad. He insists that he wants socks, too!















Then Dan takes him to a store he thinks has thick socks and things that moths like.

Reading or Vocabulary Bingo or Tic-Tac-Toe

Preparation: Cut out (optional: laminate) the two boards.

Print a copy of the word list and cut it up; separate the words from the pictures.

This game can be played a number of ways (The first one to get a line of three in a row, (across, down, or diagonal) wins.

- 1) "Tic-Tac-Toe" - Choose one board. Take turns reading a word aloud, then marking the word with an X or O.
- 2) Reading Bingo: Match word to word. Pull a word slip from a bag, read it, find the match on the bingo board, cover with token/mark with erasable pen.
- 3) Vocabulary Bingo: Match picture to word. Pull a picture slip from a bag, find the match on the bingo board and read it, cover with token/mark with erasable pen.
