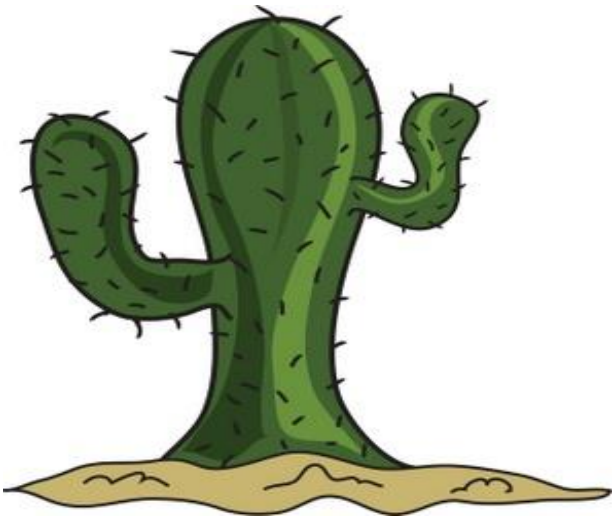


Rachel's Garden

Rachel decided to go alone. She bought a lotus flower and papyrus reeds.















"Dad will be upset if I buy a Venus Fly Trap, too", she thought. But she did anyway. She spent 500 NIS on her purchase.

Noughts and Crosses (the British name for Tic-Tac-Toe)

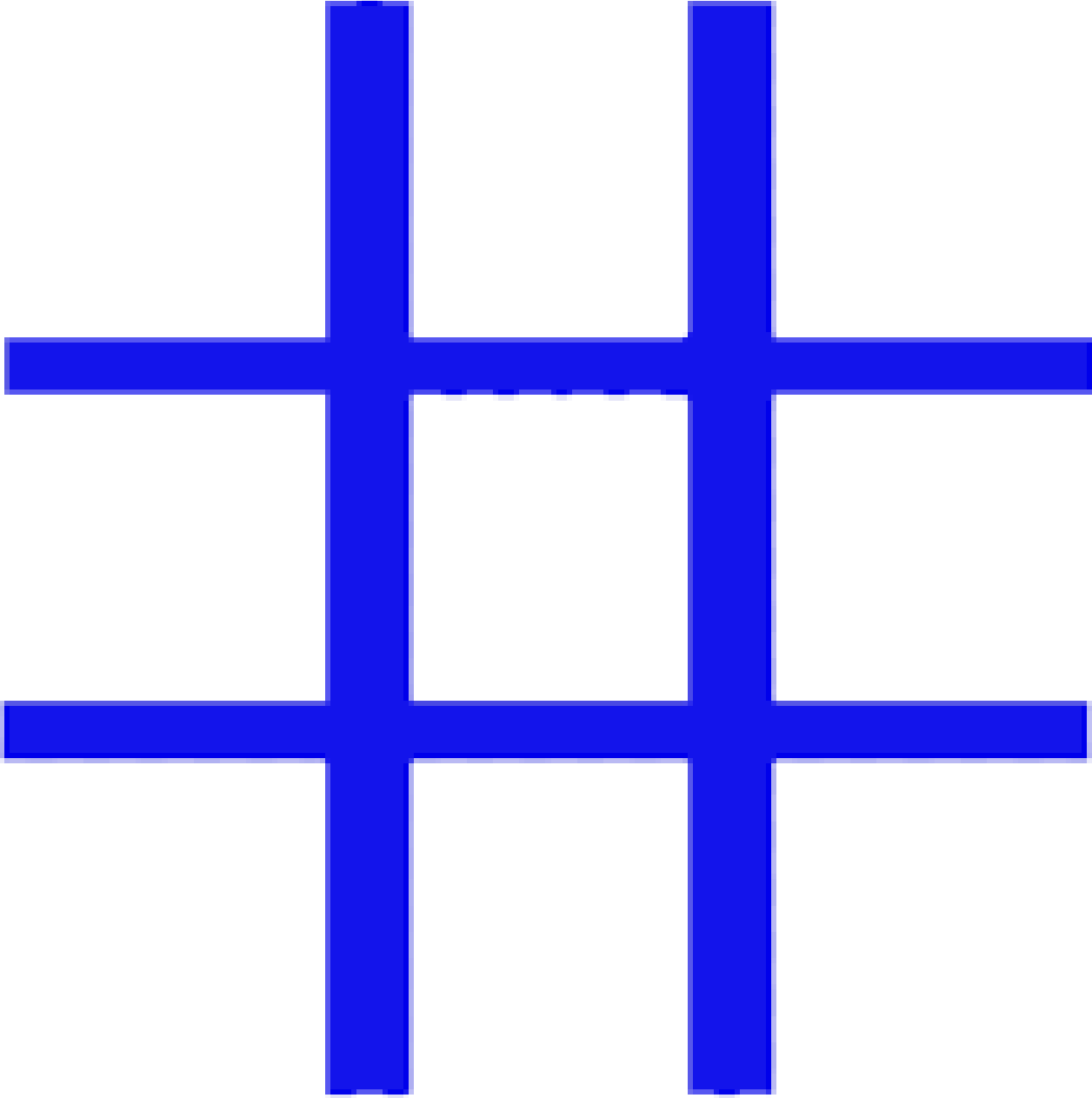
Here are the rules for a **Naughts (O) and Crosses (X)** game.

1. For a game played with printed physical elements, print and cut out the colored word cards. and the **Naughts & Crosses** board.
2. Laminate the cards and board, shuffle and turn face down.
3. The players toss a coin to decide who is **O** and who **X**
4. The player who chose **X** goes first.
5. This player picks up a card, reads it, spells it and explains the word's meaning. If the pronunciation and answer is correct, the player places a **X** on a square in the grid. (The -us and -ous words have the same sound ending. -ous is used for adjectives.)
6. The second player, **O** draws a card and repeats the procedure.
7. The game continues until one player has lined up **THREE O's** or **three X's** in adjacent or diagonal squares.

Online Lesson:

To play the game for an online lesson: use the shared whiteboard in Zoom to write the **X's** and **O's**, and use the accompanying PDF file (see link) to display the words with their pictures.

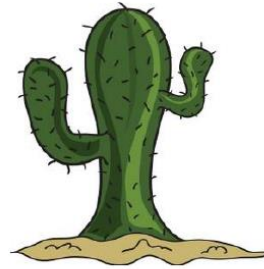
